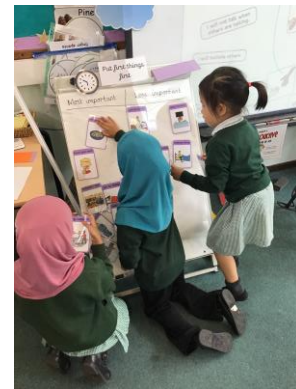
"It's to put first things first. So these were our big rocks. They are important things."
