When your sketch is complete, colour your picture using pencils or paint.</p>
<p>Write a poem based on the natural environment. Think about the animals and plants you could include in your writing.</p>	<p>Talk at home topic... Talk to someone at home about the natural environment around us, comparing the outside world to your life at home.</p>	<p>Produce an advert persuading people to grow their own fruit and vegetables at home. You may wish to do some research first. You could use iMovie or a similar App.</p>
