Everyday Attendance...

 Children must arrive on time ready to start the school day at 8.45am. Our doors are open from 8.40am and close at 8.45am. Children in Year 5 enter and leave school (at 3.15pm) by the door in the playground next to the striped wall.

95%	=	47 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 8 days in total or 1 week and 3 days
90 %	=	95 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 16 days in total or 3 weeks and 1 day
85%	=	142 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 24 days in total or 4 weeks and 4 days
80%	=	190 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 32 days in total or 6 weeks and 2 days



Everyday Attendance...

- If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, please inform the school office via email or phone message by 8.45am.
- If your child has sniffles, minor ailments and colds they can still come to school!
- If your child's attendance falls below 90% (known as 'persistent absence'), our school attendance team will be in touch with you to see how we can help support you and your family to improve your child's school attendance.
- Term time absence, other than illness, is only authorised by the Executive Headteacher in exceptional circumstances please see the Attendance Policy on the school website for more information.
- If you do wish to take your child out of school, you will need to complete an 'Absence Request' form. These can be obtained from the school office.
- New attendance guidelines were issued to schools by the DfE in August 2024 more information will be sent out to all parents very soon.



Medicines and Allergies...

- If your child requires any medication whilst in school, this must be handed into the school office at the beginning of the school day. Medication **must** be in the original packaging, in a named bag. There is a form to complete and signed by parents / carers.
- If your child has asthma and requires an inhaler / spacer, you will need to complete an asthma card. Asthma inhalers are kept in a central place in each classroom.
- We are a NUT-FREE school. Please do not send in nut or nut products (including Nutella type spreads) as part of snacks or packed lunches as we have children and staff with life-threatening allergies.



Walking to and from school...

- Children in Year 5 are able to walk to and from school independently.
- In order to do so, we must have written permission from parents / carers.

• If someone different to usual is picking up your child, please let the school office know who will then share the information with us.



Year 5 – Everyday Essentials...

- Named water bottle can be refilled throughout each day. Please take home to be washed at the end of each day. Water only please!
- Suitable shoes and clothing for all weathers
- Reading book and reading record children are able to bring books from home if they wish.
- Children **do not** need to bring pencil cases / stationery to school.
- Toys / collector cards should not be brought to school.
- No jewellery apart from watches and stud ear-rings can be worn at school.
- SMART watches which have camera or phone functions are not able to be worn at school.
- No nail varnish should be worn at school.


Year 5 – PE Days...

Communication...


- The majority of whole school communication is carried out via ParentMail.
